We audited Public Assistance (PA) funds awarded to the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) (Public Assistance Identification Number 000-UE9RA-00). Our audit objective was to determine whether DCNR accounted for and expended Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) funds according to Federal regulations and FEMA guidelines.

The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA), a FEMA grantee, awarded DCNR \$33.6 million for damages resulting from three federally-declared disasters:

- Tropical Depression Ivan (1557-DR-PA), which occurred September 17, 2004.
- Severe storms and flooding (1587-DR-PA), which occurred April 2, 2005.
- Severe storms, flooding, and mudslides (1649-DR-PA), which occurred June 23, 2006.

The audit covered the period September 17, 2004, through June 19, 2013, and included a review of 25 large and 3 small projects totaling \$27,690,926 or 82 percent of the total awards (see exhibit).¹ Table 1 provides the specifics of each disaster.

¹ Federal regulations in effect at the time of these disasters set the large project thresholds at: \$54,100 for DR-1557, \$55,500 for DR-1587, and \$57,500 for DR-1649.

We conducted this performance audit between October 2012 and August 2013 pursuant to the *Inspector General Act of 1978*, as amended, and according to generally accepted government auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain sufficient, appropriate evidence to provide a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions based upon our audit objective. We believe that the evidence obtained provides a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions based upon our audit objective. To conduct this audit, we applied the statutes, regulations, and FEMA policies and guidelines in effect at the time of each of the disasters.

We interviewed FEMA, PEMA, and DCNR officials; reviewed judgmentally selected project costs (generally based on dollar value); and performed other procedures considered necessary to accomplish our objective. We did not assess the adequacy of the DCNR's internal controls applicable to grant activities because it was not necessary to accomplish our audit objective. We did, however, gain an understanding of the DCNR's method of accounting for disaster-related costs and its policies and procedures.

RESULTS OF AUDIT

DCNR successfully managed FEMA PA grant funds for damages resulting from three separate disasters, DR-1557, DR-1587, and DR-1649. Department officials expended and accounted for PA funds according to Federal grant regulations and FEMA guidelines for the 25 large and 3 small projects we audited under the three disasters.



DISCUSSION WITH MANAGEMENT AND AUDIT FOLLOWUP

We discussed the results of our audit with DCNR, PEMA, and FEMA officials on August 13, 2013. Because the audit did not identify issues requiring further action from FEMA, at this time, we consider this audit closed.

Consistent with our responsibility under the *Inspector General Act*, we will provide copies of our report to appropriate congressional committees with oversight and appropriation responsibility over the Department of Homeland Security. We will post the report on our website for public dissemination.
